In his poems, the poet effectively used poetic arts such as revitalization, simile, simile, metaphor, contrast. Over the years, the poet's poems have been translated into English, French, and Spanish.

The theme and idea of the poem

"Wind, sea and leaf are examples

Let him breathe, let him laugh flawlessly."

Poetic arts The poem is artistically rich and melodious. The following artistic tools were used:

1. Allegory: "Trail in the taiga", "reed in hands as if swinging".

2. Metaphor: "Every line is my soul, every poem is my heart."

3. Parallelism: Similarity in the lines gives the poem its own rhythm.

4. Symbolic images: stars, sea, wind, leaf - represent the free and natural nature of poetry.

Conclusion. Alexander Feinberg's poem "Sheet" is a work that expresses the creative heritage, deep experiences of the human heart, and the eternity of poetry with a high artistic image. The poet presents his poems as a sound in the heart and a sacred treasure to be left for future generations.
